Are you at risk for lead poisoning?

KNOW THE FACTS

Summit County homeowners and landlords can apply for grant money to rehabilitate lead-based paint hazards in homes built before 1978.

Lead paint was used in homes until 1978 and more than 38 million homes may still contain lead paint.

GET HELP

You may qualify for help removing lead-based paint hazards in your home. To be eligible, the home must:

- Be located in Summit County
- Have been built before 1978
- Have a pregnant woman or child under age 6 live in the residence or visits a minimum of 6 hours a week.
- Home meets local ordinances and housing codes
- Property taxes are not delinquent

LEARN THE RISKS

Lead exposure in children and during pregnancy can lead to:

- Learning problems
- · Slow growth
- Hyperactivity
- Hearing loss
- Behavioral problems
- · Brain damage
- Babies being born too small or prematurely

INCOME GUIDELINES

Your income or tenant's income must not be more than the 2020 income guidelines:

1 person - \$44,900 5 people - \$69,250

2 people -\$51,300 6 people - \$74,400

3 people - \$57,700 7 people - \$79,500

4 people - \$64,100 8 people - \$84,650
