Washing Machine

Masks can be washed with your regular laundry, using laundry soap and warm water

- Prepare a disinfecting bleach mixture of 4 teaspoons bleach and 1 quart (4 cups) of water

- Place in dryer on the highest heat setting until
- completely dry
 Air dry, lying flat on a clean surface, and in direct sunlight if possible
